

Numbers

Numbers are good for practicing the sounds of the language. Try to copy a speaker's pronunciation of the numbers exactly in order to learn the sound system of Cherokee. Memorize the numbers from one to twenty and examples of larger numbers. Memorize one hundred, one thousand, and one million. All the other numbers are close variants of the numbers from one to twenty, one hundred, one thousand, one million, and so on. The numbers from eleven to nineteen end in the sound *-du*. Counting by tens, the numbers end in *sgohi*, or its short form *sgo*. The numbers above twenty are just combinations of lower numbers.
